PROTECTING US ON LAND, SEA AND AIR

Although we expected to hear from San Bernardino County Sheriff John McMahon this week, due to unforeseen circumstances, our local Captain and Rotarian **Rick Bessinger** came in at the 11th hour and gave a packed room some great information that showed how much more the Department does, other than arrest criminals.

Rick says that their Department has their own Air Force and Navy and he is not wrong! With 17 aircraft and a fleet of boats they have the air and water covered. In fact their pilots are trained in Fire & Rescue, and even have water dropping capabilities, so when the next brush fire happens, they are right on it.

The San Bernardino Sheriff's Department reach is expansive to say the least. From Chino Hills to the Colorado River, they patrol 20,000 square miles and protect over 2.1 million residents! To cover such a vast region they have 15 patrol stations and handle almost a million calls for service annually!

Now being an officer is more than catching the bad guy. The Department also has the H.O.P.E. (Homeless Outreach Program Enforcement) Program that assist our homeless with resources such as housing, mental health assistance

and more. Over the last year they have helped over a thousand homeless individuals, and got about 600 into necessary programs to help turn their situations around for the better.

An officer's duty also extends into the court of law, as some officers taken on the roles as Bailiffs to make sure trials and hearings run smoothly. Officers routinely work in our local detention centers keeping the guilty where they have been sentenced, behind bars. With an average daily inmate population of just over 6,000 they handle over 80,000 bookings a year. The bright light in this area is that they were able to get 18,000 of those inmates into rehabilitation programs over the past year.

Another success for the Department is the 21 field

operations they have done in the prevention of human trafficking. In these operations they have arrested 50 human traffickers and rescued 42 victims, where 21 of them were female teenagers!
