GIS Technicians: A New Breed of Hero to Public Safety



Joshua Briggs, Victor Valley College Adjunct Faculty Member, presented the Rotary Club of Victorville with an exciting program this week entitled, "Firefighters, Police Officers, Paramedics and GIS Technicians? A new breed of Hero". Claude Oliver, VVC Department Chair, introduced Joshua as a "GIS Professional", and stated that this program is key as to where jobs are headed in the future.

What is a GIS Technician? Wikpedia's definition of GIS: "A geographic information system is a system designed to capture, store, manipulate, analyze, manage, and present all types of geographical data." Joshua emphasized the importance of using geographic knowledge in many applications, including defense and intelligence, mapping, health and human services, fire fighting and public safety, to name a few. Existing available data is used in new applications in exciting new ways. As Joshua says, the possibilities are as unlimited as your imagination!

The information stored within GIS is unfathomable. The idea that this information can help predict the areas that would be impacted in a flood, for example, was very impressive, as was the "dispersal pattern of debris" following a missile explosion in mid air!

Victor Valley College offers a certificate course on GIS. Joshua stressed that mathematical skills are not paramount, but having the credential expands employment opportunities for students exiting the program.
