Technology continues to evolve year after year, but unfortunately with the advancements in the digital age, so does the criminal activity out in the world and on the Internet.

Deputy Stephen Kessler with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department visited the Club this week to alert members of the latest trends and frauds in identity theft.

Right now the biggest target are seniors and kids. Seniors are affected by this due to their lack of knowledge in some areas of digital technology, while our kids now have a much different idea of what is considered "private" due to the

growth of the social media boom. They just don't understand what is and what isn't personal information anymore.

Email scams are still the number one way thieves get access into our computers, steal information and wreak havoc. One of the best ways to counteract this is by have three email's, one for work, one for personal family and close friends only, and one for junk. The junk email is the one to use for any online shopping you do, or for signing up for anything.

Solicitation scam emails come in many forms, such as alerts of an overseas lottery winning, an inheritance, or business investment. Any time you get these type of

email's, look for the "Top Level Domain", such as emails ending in .jp (means it's actually coming from Japan), .au (Australia), .ru (Russia) and more. Of course NEVER open an attachment that doesn't look right, it can cause a massive virus, and allow criminals access to your computer to steal credit card information and much more. Sometimes these also come in the form of a text message or a

phone call. If it doesn't seem right... it probably isn't.

Always do online searches for any unsolicited company contacting you. Look for reviews and keywords like "complaint" or "scam". Know that these scammers can sometime manipulate your Caller ID, so the name you see might not be real. If anyone asks you for personal information or money, hang up.

Nowadays everybody pays for something online, and most credit cards now have fraud protection built in, but some payment methods do not. Be wary of people asking you to use wire services like Western Union, MoneyGram, or reloadable cards like MoneyPak and others, as those are not protected and any legitimate company would never ask you to pay that way.

The Internet can be full of wonder and discovery, but can also be dangerous and treacherous, and as we were told as children, always be aware of your surroundings.
