AN IMPROVED HIGHWAY 18

Our streets and roads have been going through a transformation in recent years. On May 20th the Green Tree Extension will finally be opened, and more is on the way. Rotarian **Rob Kilpatrick** from Dave Evans & Associates has been a part of road improvements in our community for many years including doing studies for widening I Avenue in Hesperia and a revitalization of the Village in Apple Valley.

This week, Rob spoke on the study currently taking place in the Desert Knolls area of Highway 18, between Apple Valley Road and Base Hill Road. The corridor includes the Highway 18 frontage roads, sidewalks parallel to the Highway and adjacent roadways and parcels accessible to the highway.

The Highway 18 Access Plan will create a list of prioritized and phased projects to help re-engineer a safer and more accessible Highway 18. Funding for this Plan was received through the Sustainable Communities Transportation Grant provided by Caltrans.

The project goals and outcomes will be guided by community input throughout the development of the plan to create a safer and better connected Highway 18.

The Plan begins in getting information in three areas. The first area is for traffic and roadway improvements. This will include road safety features to better alert drivers and motorists. The next area is in pedestrian improvements. The idea is to increase pedestrian safety by providing more access and visibility for those walking in the corridor. The third area of investigation is bicycle improvements for safe and comfortable options for traveling

by bike.

Heading into the Plan are issues of the lack of pedestrian walkways including sidewalks and crosswalks. Another area to look into is how Victor Valley Transit uses this area. Two of VVTA's most popular routes, Route 41 and Route 15 run through this corridor and will be even more vital when Brightline comes to fruition. The other concern is what to do withe the frontage roads (Outer Hwy 18). A Town of Apple Valley ordinance requires all developers to look into removing frontage roads. There are also drainage issues on the frontage roads just to the south of Tao Road. Possible uses for the frontage roads could include sidewalks, bike lanes, or maybe a multi-use path for more uses.

This week we welcomed **Harrison Hove**, who attended with **Jon Hove**.




Fine Session
