## **How To Make And Maintain A Successful Business**



**Scott Nassif** learned what it takes to make and keep a business successful at a very young age. He was only 20 years old and working at a Napa Auto Parts Store here in the High Desert when the owners decided to liquidate and sell the business. It made sense to offer Scott the opportunity to buy the business – he had already quadrupled sales by working with customers and suppliers, providing solutions and creating stronger partnerships.

Charles Gehrke handled the formalities of introducing our newest member, Regina "Gina" Pické. Gina is the





Scott then had to learn how to manage employees. He now has 65 employees and 4 store locations in the Victor Valley. Some have been loyal employees for over 20 years. Scott works at keeping his employees engaged and fresh with incentives and stressing the importance of their partnership. He has learned that you have to hire people that are honest, nice and willing to learn. "You can't train people to be nice. You hire nice people to train."

When it came to expanding the business, Scott was very conservative and studied important considerations. Can the note be paid even if the new location isn't profitable? Can I rent the property before buying it? What should be my benchmarks?

Scott stressed the importance of making a 5 and 10 year plan to keep technology current and physical appearance fresh. He also emphasized the value of staying up to date with market research and keeping his business diversified in order to stay successful as the economy and needs change.

Scott looks at his business as a two-way partnership with his customers, his employees, and his suppliers by looking at how they are a part of his success, and how he can be a part of their success as well.

Scott has taken his knowledge and partnership principles to the political arena. He now serves as Mayor of the Town of Apple Valley.
