The Club was honored this week to have **Danny Garcia**, a 19-year veteran of the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department speak to us about Cultural Diversity in the community. Danny began his career as an officer, then through the Gang and Narcotics Units, and now is with the Public Affairs Division and has a lot of experience in this arena.

Another word for Cultural Diversity can be Racial Profiling,

and this is a very serious concern for officers and detectives in our county; so much so that in the Academy officers are trained to work on verbal skills to both defuse situations between officer and different cultures, as well as communicating better with the public.

share similarities. Cultural Diversity is the representation or existence of individuals with distinctly different group affiliations or system. The benefits of different cultures can be seen in music, food and the Arts, plus can help us better understand and appreciate our differences.

While out dealing with the public, officers must deal with three facets of this; stereotypes, prejudice and discrimination. A stereotype is oversimplified belief about another culture, and in most aspects in terms of behavior, language, style, age, religions, values, physical abilities and life experiences. Have you ever heard that "all cops love donuts?" That is a stereotype. Growing from there is a prejudice, with goes from belief to opinion about another culture, which can then lead to discrimination, which deals with the unfair treatment of another due to cultural differences.

Danny discussed cultural differences with the members; for example Americans are expressive, like direct eye contact and personal space of 2-3ft, Hispanics are openly expressive, diverted eye contact and personal space about 16", Asians are quiet and soft spoken, avoid eye contact and like close physical personal space and Law Enforcement Officers are authoritative, direct eye contact and protect their personal space.

Danny and the many officers with the San Bernardino County Sheriffs must know, understand and diffuse many situations daily, due to cultural differences, but their knowledge of Cultural Diversity allows them the upper hand in many cases. The sad part is with all this discrimination, one thing that most people forget is that every culture and race has made a substantial contribution to American History.
