STANDING UP FOR WHAT IS RIGHT

This week the Club held our annual George
Hensel Essay Contest, named after fellow
Rotarian, businessman, and philanthropist,
George R. Hensel, Ph.D., who privately funded
the contest before his passing in 2012. **Dr. Ron Boyd** put together this year's contest and began
by reading the essays of the runners-up, who
were unable to attend due to Finals. **Lilliana Beatty** from Excelsior wrote on being kind and
considerate to others, following the Golden
Rule to "Do unto others as you would have
them do unto you". The next runner -up, **Julia Cervantes** from Cobalt High School shared a
story of her grandfather wanting to pass way

at home surrounded by family, instead of alone in a hospital and her wanting him to stay there to try and get better. Both students received \$75 for their essays.

In person was our winner, **Serenity Barba**, also of Cobalt, who read her essay. In April of this year, her school announced that they would have to take back the books they were reading for that semester. They said the books were not suitable for the school's curriculum, and therefore not suitable for the students. The book that was going to be taken from her grade was "Night", by Elie Wiesel. "Night" is a more personal look into the lives of the victims of the holocaust and is very important to history. It was a part of history, and their school wasn't going to let them learn it.

Never seeing herself as rebellious, Serenity arrived at school the next day and peaceful protests were already happening all around campus. She decided she would need to take a risk and keep the book, as she felt no one had the right to censor her education, even as uncomfortable as it was in the pages of the book. Would she give up valedictorian for a failure to return this library book?' When the time came around, she did what she never thought she would do. She admitted to herself that the administration was wrong, and she hid her book. Serenity was not going to play by the rules this time, as she knew the people in

charge were wrong.

In the end, the principal informed the students that this was a social experiment to see how they would react to censorship of their education. The principal told them about how censorship was happening in other countries, and she wanted to know how her students would react. The students were told that no consequences would be given to anyone who still had their books. Ethics to Serenity is being able to see what the right thing to do is when things are wrong. It is the will to have the courage to stand up for what you believe in. Ethics is simply the ability to recognize when a human being is being stripped of their human rights.

Serenity won \$150 and will go on to the District Finals, where she could win \$3,000!
