THERE'S A NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN

This week the Rotary Club had a chance to hear from our new Victorville Division Captain of the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, **John Wickum**.

Due to a lot of legislation coming out of Sacramento, the Department must be in compliance constantly with the Bills that come through. Of the many, one of those is RIPA, the Racial Identity Profiling Act.

In 2018 the Sheriff Department

was required to document every traffic stop, detention and search of who the person was, and capture all the data. There are about 16 items an officer must put down, including day, date, and time of the incident, as well as the officer's determination of the person's race, gender, and age. They cannot ask these questions of the individual, only their perceptions.

In 2019, and on an annual basis, all of this information must be submitted to the Department of Justice (DOJ) and it is then analyzed as to how the agency is responding in regards to race. The results of the findings from 2019 said their department is very consistent in their reporting information. The info is a result of the

well trained officers, as well as the diverse population of San Bernardino County.

The Department will be increasing with extra staff plus other action items to combat the growing traffic problem, mainly individuals running red lights. As we are now all too familiar with, anytime a light turns green, you need to count three seconds before going, because 9 times out of 10,

anywhere from 2-4 cars will blow through the intersection. The problem is getting so bad, that on the day they put an officer at a single intersection it resulted in a whopping 63 situations for running red lights! There has also been a large increase of DUI accidents and fatalities. The Victorville Station has been combining with other area Divisions to have a larger single-day traffic enforcement operations.

In addition to drivers blowing through intersections, there is also the increasing issue issues of front window tinting on vehicles, and a growing number of street racing activity. The key to the Department's success is the new officers they hire to double their Traffic Division, so drivers see more officers, in part thanks to the 1% increase in sales tax from Measure B, on the streets patrolling and writing tickets.

In the end, it is apparent that Captain John and his staff are doing all they can to make our streets safer, and as a Rotary Club, we thank the whole Department for their bravery and dedication to keep us all safer.


