

It was particularly appropriate that young future leaders and Rotarians were present, as Dr. Thorn discussed the relevance of the span of a lifetime. Using a line with points on each end indicating "birth" and "death", we experienced an enlightening visual of just where we are in our lifetime, and the importance of the time we have left.

A pioneer and leader in the field of work/life balance, Andrew Thorn is widely recognized for his breakthrough thinking on how to help people discover their sense of purpose and create greater meaning from their personal and professional experiences. He holds a PhD in Consulting Psychology, a Masters in Business Administration and a Masters in Personal and Executive Coaching. Dr. Thorn works with many Fortune 500 companies, has been in our high desert for 23 years, and has seven children! We soon realized that Dr. Thorn's presentation was going to be fascinating.
