Last year new Rotarian and incoming Fire Chief **Greg Benson** spoke to the Club about the changes that would be coming to the Victorville Fire Department. Now that the calendar has turned to 2019, Greg was back to share an update on what has happened since the new Department went active on March 30th. Greg calls it the era of change for the City of Victorville Fire Department.

With a new vision intact, Greg and his staff focus on the main

areas to our local community of "Service, Safety, and Excellence". Running a Fire Department will only be a success when, much like a business, can adapt to change. C h a n g e s such as so ci a l, legal,

cultural, political, economic and technological, are imperative to adapt to or they will certainly fail. One way Greg acted upon this was in his interviewing process of new recruits. He would ask them, "How do you see the future of the Fire Department," and if their answer was keeping it the same "if it's broke, don't fix it", then they were not hired. In the end, 62 people were hired who wanted to see the Department grow and improve.

The status quo doesn't work anymore. A Fire Department needs to operate smoother, use resources better, be part of the local government and add value to the community. A way to operate smoother, they now have a Tiered Dispatch system, in which only the proper apparatus is dispatched, depending on the severity of the incident. The "Big Red Truck" is not always needed, and has reduced its use by 10%, saving over 110 work hours! On top of all that it has also decreased overall costs to the City.

Currently they are implanting new partnerships with other organizations and businesses. A great example is the "Fireworks Intervention Program", in where they partner with the Police, and Code Enforcement to curb the number of illegal fireworks in the High Desert. Another successful partnership has been the Homelessness Task Force with the San Bernardino County Sheriff Department.

In adding value to the community, Greg and his staff combine law enforcement and public education with such educational programs as Stop the Bleeding, CPR Training, Home Safety and "Plus Point", which is a Phone App available for those who know CPR, and are alerted when there is CPR help needed in the area.
