


Crime Prevention: the Key to Reduce Crime

David North Capt. Joe Alvarez Val Vetack Al Castellucci David North Stevens discussed various laws and propositions passed in California the past seven years which have in effect contributed to criminals being held less accountable for their actions, receive minimal consequences if they're caught, and has led to apathy and complacency by the general public.

As a result Stevens believes that because law enforcement is, always have been and always will be outnumbered by criminals, law abiding citizens should do more to minimize and reduce their risk of becoming a crime victim. Hiring more law enforcement personnel is not a sustainable option because of escalating costs—Victorville's contract for law enforcement services alone for Fiscal Year 2017-18 is \$1.4 million dollars more because of salary and benefit costs.

Stevens encouraged members to adopt the "Safety Continuum" which simply means do more to enhance, improve or increase our personal safety, and by default it will lower, reduce and decrease our crime risk.

Stevens started a grassroots coalition in November 2017 known as Citizens for Safer Communities, and this Coalition is working in partnership with other organizations to develop a long-range plan to address factors causing criminal behavior and not just simply be reactive and address the symptom.
