Fighting Back Against the Gangs

John Billings, the Lieutenant in charge of the San Bernardino County Gang Unit, is a 20 year veteran of the force. He has seen it all, and due to his exemplary service, is now in charge of the growing gang problem in our County.

The origins of the Gang Unit started with the SMASH Program, that was formed in the mid 1980's as a way to combat crime, drugs and gang violence in San Bernardino County. In the early 2000's the Sheriff Department started to see more and more gang activity starting in San Bernardino County, and in 2004 the first Gang Unit was born. Of course, as we all know in 2011, due to the passing of AB109, a lot of the crimes SMASH used to handle as felonies, were now turned into misdemeanors and with Prop 24 in 2014, soon the amount of time and resources

used for the SMASH program, were not equaling out, so it was closed.

investigations to patrol stations, a fifth Homicide Team, and a new fully dedicated Gang Unit.

As of April 2015, there were three dedicated Gang Units, the Desert Team, the Valley Team and a Gang Intelligence Task Force, which consists of the San Bernardino Sheriff, Police CHP and FBI.

The focus of the Unit is to suppress illegal gang activity, with a proactive street level enforcement to target specific gang members and to work hand in hand with the Sheriff Stations and Police Departments. The Unit works very hard to monitor and track illegal gang activity, work with officers as well as inmates for intelligence and undercover work.

Now the good news. Since its inception, just over 1 year ago, all three Gang Teams have made 1025 arrests, of which 719 were felonies, served 190 search warrants on gang members, seized over 200 high powered firearms, identified almost 1,000 new gang members and submitted over 200 cases to the DA's Office with Gang Enhancements, which, if convicted, will send these thugs to State Prisons for longer sentences than they would have normally received for the same crime, had they not been in a gang.

The overall goal is to reduce violence and enhance public safety, which they are doing. Please keep people like **John Billings** and **Sam Lucia** in your constant thoughts and prayers, as they risk their lives each and every day to make our lives safer.
