A great presentation was made to Rotary this week by James Johnson, Contract and Community Education Manager for Victor Valley College. Since 2012, he has brought in \$1.5 million dollars for VVC contract education! James is also the Inland Empire Deputy Sector Navigator, Small Business, which provides opportunities for community colleges to become essential catalysts to California's economic recovery and jobs creation at the local, regional and state levels. His Power Point showed us how this works. In California, 52% of the income is generated by small business. Trends show that there is a shortage of talent available; James explained the skill sets needed, and the importance of work experience. He cited the need for "articulation" between high schools and the community college systems; stressed the need for supplemental degrees; and most importantly, the need for students to become more "globally minded". "Digital Badging" is something few of us were familiar with, until James explained this newest technology!






