Rehab is for Quitters

This week Rotarians received a great understanding of just what takes place at the High Desert Crisis Walk-in Center in Victorville. **Jennifer Malara**, Clinical Director and Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, accompanied by **Brittney Hardy**, a Clinical Supervisor at the center, serve more than just homeless and drug addicts.

The Center, located on Hesperia road, provides urgent mental

health services to people who are allowed to stay 23 hours and 59 minutes a day, in a living room type setting where people suffering from severe mental illness, drug addiction, family therapy and so much more. They work with all age groups, all the way to infants, to help families discover where problem areas lie.

The Walk-in Center is staffed by licensed LVNs and LPTs, Peer mental Family Advocates, Mental Health Clinicians, and Psychiatrists, to give people in need ease to get help quietly and confidentially. They provide a holistic approach to wellness and accept anybody regardless of age or insurance. All of their services are specifically tailored to each individual's needs and many of the staff are available to write "holds", which allows them to take

In some cases they are unable to help people. If someone comes in too intoxicated or high, violent or aggressive, then the Center cannot assist, as they are a "hands off" facility, meaning they do not restrain, or keep someone against their will.

They see around 2,000 people a year, and with limited psychiatric services and hospitals in the High Desert, it can be very challenging and leave them short staffed to get people where they can get to the next step in recovery. They are also in need of finding local detox and sober living homes for people who want to stay clean off drugs.
