> purchase new equipment and personnel, that hadn't been done in 5 years.

Of course the Country was not happy that the Council wanted to keep

local control and did everything they could to stop Measure K, through accusations that sales tax collected could be used for anything the council wanted, even though it was earmarked

strictly for the Department and personal hit pieces we mailed.

The Measure needed 66% to pass. It only received 64% of the vote. Even though the outcome was not what Jim and other council members have hoped for, we still need a Fire Department. The City will be going with the County for a contract lasting from July 2018 through March 2019. From that we have a new Chief Greg Benson, five new pieces of equipment, new fire fighters, and a much needed face lift for a few of our stations. The best part is that the City of Victorville will be ready to go with our own Fire Department in 9 months!
