- ★ Don Lager's original Midway Appliance was a mere 700 square feet!
- ★ The area was the original location of many car dealerships which have since relocated.
- ★ Terry's Alma Mater, Barstow High, was undefeated (football) for a total of ten years!
- ★ Bob's Tire Service has been around since 1975... always offering the best in service to its customers.
- ★ In 1963, Victor Valley College classes were held at the High School on Mojave Drive!
- ★ Both our Mall of Victor Valley and the #15 Freeway interchange were a result of the tenacity and determination of our visionary politicians.
