RAIDS, TICKETS, AND MORE OFFICERS

This week the Club was honored to host our San Bernardino Country Sheriff **Shannon Dicus**, on the day of his election to the County. Sheriff Dicus gave the group a report on what the Department has been doing, as well as an outlook for the future.

Shannon was appointed on July 14, 2021, to serve as the 36th Sheriff of San Bernardino County. Before his time with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, Shannon served as a Military Policeman in the U.S. Army's

101st Airborne Division and as a federal law enforcement officer with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. He began his career with the Sheriff's Department in 1991.

In his previous position as Undersheriff, Shannon was responsible for managing the daily operations of the Department. During that time, one of his significant accomplishments was completing the "Jail Utilization Study." The project was conducted in partnership with CalForward to determine the effects of prison realignment and recidivism in our jail system.

Shannon earned a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from California State University, San Bernardino, and a

master's degree in Communications from California Baptist University.

Shannon has extensive experience in many assignments. He worked in both the Glen Helen Rehabilitation and West Valley Detention centers. On patrol, he served the communities of Apple Valley, Barstow, Victorville, and Victor Valley. His specialized assignments were in Narcotics, SWAT, and the Criminal Intelligence Divisions. As an Assistant Sheriff, Shannon was responsible for three Bureau Deputy Chiefs, who oversaw the Corrections, Field Support Services, and

Personnel/Training Bureaus.*

Throughout this year the Department has been doing massive raids on Illegal Marijuana grows in the County. Their latest raid in late May, yielded over \$9 million in illegal product in an underground bunker in Newberry Springs.

The Department was also busy with their Crime Suppression Unit, going after those who needed to be off the street. Searches and arrest were made for those to committed parole violations, had warrants out for them or were wanted by the police.

Also widely reported was their sting operation, with sheriff deputies from all over the county to tackle the rash of illegal driving here in the High Desert. What the Sheriff calls "Covid Driving", occupants using emergency lanes, crossing double yellow lines, plus using stop signs and traffic lights as a "suggestion". They recently cited over 180 drivers in the Victor Valley in a single day!

Hiring has been an issue with the San Bernardino County Sheriff Department. With the pandemic, the fear of attacks, and officers leaving California for more "police friendly" states, it has been a challenge to fill positions. Shannon was happy to report that by the

Fall around 150 new officers will be joining the ranks of the County, with about 40 of them dispatched to the High Desert.

The Sheriff also spoke about the fentanyl crisis here in our Country. Last year alone there were 106 fentanyl overdoses, with 96 of them ending in deaths. To make matters worse, many of them were teenagers. He is working hard on this, going to Sacramento working with legislators on Bills to get a handle on epidemic.

In the future, the Department is looking to increase efficiency with a phone app, where a live person will be able to take a police report within a few minutes instead of waiting sometimes hours for an officer to arrive. This will be used for low level crimes such as minor traffic accidents and vandalism, and business break-ins.

As a Club, we thank Sheriff Shannon Dicus and his whole Department for working so hard 24/7 to keep our residents and our businesses safe.
