BEING TOGETHER WHILE APART

They had one week. One week to change everything over. Two years before COVID-19, **Dr. Ron Williams** and his staff at

the Victor Valley Union High School District had developed a campaign called "Re-Define, Re-Design and Re-Imagine" for their area schools, and on March 13th, this was the mantra they used to get through the school year. First it was a scheduled 2-week closure, which worked out since it was leading into Spring Break time, but within two weeks it was announced schools were to be closed for the remainder of the year.

The VVUHSD handles 10,500 students in 8 schools within the Victor Valley, and 1,000 staff members, with almost half that number teachers. Due to the short time

span, the focus had to change and fast! This unexpected turn of events had the staff communicating with teachers, parents and students over emails, phone calls, press releases and social media. In this 7-day time span the District set up complete online education, supporting 480 teachers and parents with lessons on how to work Zoom, virtual classrooms

and even digital textbooks for students who still had hard copy textbooks in their school lockers.

Even with schools closed, the internal functions they provide to the community still needed to continue, such as payroll. Paying staff, vendors and contracts continued without fail. Many families in the community rely on school breakfast and lunch programs and that program did not cease either, for the remainder of the school year, 15,000 – 16,000 students were fed weekly!

Many families served by the District live well below the poverty line and because if this, they cannot afford Wi-Fi, laptops or tablets, which is essential for students to have in online learning.

To solve this, the District developed Wi-Fi access on their buses and parked them in different locations around the community so students could go to parks and log in for their classes. Along with the buses, they also had Wi-Fi hot-spot devices and brought them to student's homes as well as Chromebooks for all students. Finally, with the stress of being stuck at home and with some parents being laid off from work, the District helped with mental health issues and set up hotlines for a variety of issues.

Graduation for this year's Seniors was not like anything they've experienced before. The District started with virtual graduations with pre-recorded speeches, they then moved to drive-thru graduations for diplomas. It was a little challenging at first and took a while to do it; about

30 students an hour, but once they got to the bigger schools like Victor Valley and Silverado, they had it down and got through them in a matter of hours. This year marked one of the highest percentages of graduates and they feel this was due to their great teachers who went the extra mile to work closer with students than ever before.

Dr. Ron Williams doesn't know what August 2020 will look like when the school year is set to begin again, but he hopes it will be a combination of physical and digital learning. On the digital side, the District has the Victor Valley Virtual Academy set up and ready to roll out on August 1st, offering 220 standard school credits, great courses, advanced placement and honor classes. The academy is set up for parents who are concerned

with sending their children back to school while Coronavirus is still a reality. Although the WUHSD doesn't know what school will exactly look like in the Fall, there will be classes and the learning will continue.
