

Don pitched against the great **Hank Aaron** 14 times with only 4 hits. One of those times Don struck out



Hank with an illegal spit ball. Hank Aaron was not happy!

Yogi Berra (14/3) said that Don had the best curve ball in the game, while **Ted Williams**, who was considered the best hitter in baseball, (7/1) had a different opinion. At an Orioles vs Yankees game, Ted went to the plate against Don. Don threw 2 curve balls for strikes, while Ted just stood there at the plate. On the third pitch Ted hit the ball so hard he knocked the shortstop over! When Ted made it to first, he told the baseman that, "Don's curve ball can kiss his A%#!"

Don also shared stories about such greats as **Stan Musial, Billy Martin, Frank Robinson, Ernie Banks, Mickey Mantle, Roger Maris** and **Larry Doby**, the first Black player in the American League.
