

June 13, 2023 BETRAYAL: A JOURNEY IN THE MUSIC INDUSTRY

Rotarian and Victor Valley Transit Senior Marketing Manage/PIO, **Chris Ackerman**, has been part of the local business community for 25 years, but had a very interesting life before that. One aspect of his life not many know was the years he spent in the music industry as the vocalist for a Christian heavy metal band called Betrayal.



His story began when he was only 15 years old in North Hollywood where he began to work as a Roadie for a variety of bands on the famed Sunset Strip. After accepting Christ at 17 years old, his journey led him to roadie and soon become Stage & Road Manager for a Christian band called Martyr in 1987. Chris loved his work and was happy to be running things in the background and out of the spotlight.

The band splintered apart in 1989 and were left without a vocalist. The remaining members of Martyr convinced Chris to do one show as front man, to his vehement objections, since he was the only one who knew the words to all their songs. After that one show, the band said there was no other choice, Chris would be the vocalist of this new band called Betrayal. This band's mission was ministry first and

foremost, focusing on kids who were deeply involved in Satanism and leading them to Christ.

Based on their demo tape "Reviling Darkness", in 1991 the band were signed to Wonderland Records out of Chicago and proceeded to Illinois to record their debut album, "Renaissance by Death". Ministry still at the

forefront while the touring cycle continued, but one fact was made apparent to Chris, even for a highly respected Christian label, money was more important than ministry.

A perfect example is the band made a half cent on each CD sold, and even less for cassettes. Before the band saw one dime, they had to pay back all recording costs, marketing and promotion from those sales. The objective was to keep them playing live and selling more albums. In fact, Chris did make money during all the years in Betrayal; one royalty check of \$14, for a song he wrote for their follow up album.

By the time their sophomore release, "The Passing" hit the streets, ministry took a backseat and "making it" was all anyone from band members to the record company spoke about. After a failed showcase show for major label Interscope Records and horrible accident while on their way for a tour of Texas, the band were spent emotionally and spiritually. Chris left Los Angles and moved to Apple Valley where he cut off his hair, denied ever being in a band, and left Christianity behind for the next 20 years.

But something happened in 2018. Chris found Christ again and rededicated his life, more mature and focused than before. After rebuilding his walk with God for about a year and a half, Betrayal's albums were re-released on CD
