Recently the world's attention has been focused on a handful of countries... Tunisia, Egypt, Bahrain and Libya since the first popular protests broke out in Tunisia in December. Nearly a dozen countries in the region have seen political unrest, and are experiencing some form of the democratization process. Both Egypt and Tunisia have ousted their leaders, and face some difficult times restructuring. In Libya, Syria, and Yemen there is violence and untold brutality erupting between the government and the masses, all for the price of freedom.

Dino tells us, "The peoples of the region want democracy. They want freedom of speech, freedom of press, freedom of expression, Internet freedom, etc., and it is spreading like wildfire."

"It is vital to our foreign policy that we understand the issues facing these countries", says Dino. If you want to know more, visit "aljazeera.com", but be prepared for some anti-Americanism.
