responsible for overseeing three other archivists in reviewing and providing detailed records of where and when the footage was shot.

As an archivist and a researcher, he watched and knew every film in the library. David dealt directly with many diverse clients as they searched for specific stock footage for use in their individual productions. Most of these requests were pretty straightforward and easily handled, but some requests were impossible to fulfill.

A lot of people who were looking for stock footage actually didn't understand that this was real military battles caught on film, they truly believed these were staged reenactments! One of those requests came from a film producer that demand he be given film footage of a MIG fighting against an F-4 Fighter and wanted to see a missile to missile fight and see one go right into the planes tailpipe and then see the reaction of the pilot's face right before he hit the ground!

Those who did understand the genesis of the films actually made for some very odd requests. One such person asked David to feel free to show him any classified material or anything that was strictly labeled as "need to know".

One type of film David would not release was Vietnam footage of soldiers being wounded in battle, in case the solder had died later on due to the injuries sustained. He had numerous requests over the years for UFO footage from Roswell in 1947, and told the Club that none actually exists.

Finally, with all the crazy requests, he was once allowed to help someone. A mother had never gotten a chance to see her son in uniform, and because David knew every frame of footage in the library, she was able to finally see her son as a military man.


A Fond Farewell
