40 Years of Building, Growth, and Playing with Kids



When it comes to caring for our community, the efforts of Ginger Ontiveros, the executive Director of the Victor Valley College Foundation is second to none! Today she shared with Victorville Rotary a history lesson of the VVC Foundation: 40 Years of Changing Lives.

Beginning with John Kronke sharing the Foundation's humble start in 1975, Ginger took us through a year by year analysis of their growth and success. From the start of the Capri Home, a Child Development Center in the 70's, to the 80's where, in addition to the growth of the child Development Center with a playground, the Foundation bought screens and material for the genesis of the Performing Arts Center

In the 1990's, the Performing Arts Center grew, as well as

the Child Development Center. As Ginger stated, "We really like to play with kids"! But the 90's didn't end there. in that decade the Foundation helped get Tennis Courts built and helped the College open the Student Activity Center.

From 2000 - 2008 they began successful fundraising campaigns, as well as expanded their popular nursing program, by partnering with local area hospitals, as well as starting an aviation program as well.

From 2009 to the present, the Foundation has helped raise millions to provide solar to the campus, as well as their solar training program, and worked with Edison to start the Math Success Center for tutoring and more. Their fundraisers have gotten a lot of attention internationally. Recently their hugely successful "Great Alumni Hunt" won the Gold Award at the International Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE). Silver and bronze awards went to other small community colleges like Georgetown University, and the University of British Columbia!

Ben's Practice Session


Ben Tafoya was getting a little "Practice Time" in before settling into his new role as our 2015-2016 President by filling in for the absent **Steve Murray**.


