St. Joseph Health-St. Mary Medical Center has never lost sight of its original vision from founder Father Jean Pierre Médaille: "Go out into the city, divide the neighborhoods, find out the needs, do your best to meet those needs, and find others who want to do good works with you." **John Kozyra** from St. Mary Medical Center, who spoke to our Club, continues that vision.

Finemaster: David North needs of the community, every three years the hospital conducts a Community Needs Assessment within neighborhoods as well as on their website. Since 2018 the top three community needs have been the same; access to care, mental health and obesity prevention.

To address the needs to better access to care the Hospital has three fixed clinics in Adelanto, Victorville and Apple Valley, while providing the Bright Futures Mobile Clinic that makes stops in Lucerne Valley, The James Woody Community Center, Phoenix Academy and St. Joan of Arc. They also have a Family Resource Center with diabetes education, nutrition counseling, and mental health counseling.

Mental health is a major issue in the High Desert but John and his staff are working hard to break its stigma by providing help for at-risk youth, to try and combat the increasing cases of teen suicide, substance abuse and depression/anxiety.

John is extremely proud of the NSS-2 Bridge program too. Only 31 hospitals are part of this program that helps with overdosing and recovery of those suffering from addiction to opioids. This is a great need in our community and he is so happy to offer this help.

For those struggling with obesity, the Hospital has dedicated programs and activities at Richardson Park in Adelanto and Doris Davies Park in Victorville. They also provide community clean up days and free exercise programs throughout the High Desert.

As the years continue, the hospital will expand and grow. Right now they are struggling with only 212 beds, but their 1,700 plus staff are working diligently to service all the needs of this community.
