COLDWELL BANKER IS OPTIMISTIC ABOUT H.D. REAL ESTATE

Jason Lamoreaux, President of Coldwell Banker Commercial, returned this year to the Rotary Club of Victorville, offering some positive news for the local economy and commercial real estate. Coldwell Banker specializes in all aspects of real estate: Industrial / Land / Multi-Family / Office and Retail. Jason stated that housing, construction, employment, consumer confidence and the financial markets all have a huge impact on our H.D. real estate. Little has changed since Jason addressed Rotary in March of 2011, however, according to statistics, there is a brighter outlook in 2012. Residential real estate is on the rise, and the positive indicators show that housing sales are increasing, demand is high, and prices are affordable. The inventory is at its lowest in some time: down to 1.4 months, a sharp decline compared to the numbers given in 2011. "The demand is incredible; the supply is not there." Jason's graphs were particularly revealing, and in comparison of commercial vacancy rates in the Inland Empire versus the High Desert's vacancy rate, the H.D. comes out the winner. "According to the USC 2011 Industrial and Office Report, the past four quarters are pointing towards a

recovery and less economic challenges. We have seen a growing trend of businesses moving into local office space. This creates jobs and reflects a positive impact on the community." (1st Quarter "High Desert Market Watch".)

Jason listed the following centers as a positive reflection on successful commercial real estate: Southern California Logistics Airport Jess Ranch Market Place / High Desert Gateway / Desert Plazas / Three WalMarts. All of these centers are prospering in a "down" market. We hope that Jason's forecasts are right, and that we are headed in the right direction!

Cookies from Charles this week went to Eldon and Sharon Heaston and Sandra Luna.


Kids Against Hunger,
