Next President Arsalee gave a recap of her Rotary year. Funds the Club raised goes directly back into the community including \$4,000 to the Victor Valley College Foundation, \$1,000 to the Police Activities

League, \$5000 towards Read B4K and 47 Teacher Mini-Grants were awarded totaling \$12,918.62.



The Club hosted a couple of fundraising opportunities including a Comedy Night in November and poured beer at the Victorville Stage Bike Race.

Giving back to the community is one of the most important missions to the Club and during Arsalee's presidency a canned food drive was restarted, while some members went to Enseñada to visit the Water Tank Project and Orphanage. Members this year were extremely generous in donating money and items for 18 Easter Baskets for those in need in Victorville.

Finally, **Steve Murray** then gave a preview of his year as Rotary President that will begin July 1st. With the expansion coupled with the rising costs of Read B4k, the Club will need to come up with additional funding to keep it going. Steve and his team will be looking into corporate sponsorships
