

SUPPRESSING CRIME AT ITS SOURCE

What a way to start off a new Rotary year by receiving a visit and update from San Bernardino County Sheriff John McMahon! John spoke to our Club about the success of their 9-month long Crime Suppression program, which targets criminal operations that are causing them the most grief, not just individuals with warrants.

With this program they are targeting guns, drugs, and human trafficking crimes. Since its inception, they have made over 700

felony arrests, destroyed \$14mil in drugs including 568lbs of Meth and taken 480 guns out of the hands of criminals. Around human trafficking, they have rescued 49 people, with 26 of them being minors!

Finemaster: David North criminal activity; the Department has now partnered with a Hesperia faith based program with resounding success. This organization takes EVERY released prisoner to a loved one or family members' home, homeless shelter, Salvation Army or even a hotel if the shelters are full, and assist those who truly don't want to return to a life of crime, with a variety of programs to put them on a path of redemption and success! Since implementing this partnership, the number of re-arrests has dropped significantly.

Due to the success of these programs the County Board has gotten behind the Sheriff's Department and have added a million dollars to the Crime Suppression Program, in addition funding for 9 additional dispatchers and the successful H.O.P.E. Program for the homeless situation is now being funded by the County.

Finally, Sheriff McMahon spoke about his meeting with our President Donald Trump. At a County Sheriffs Meeting in D.C., shared a story with some officials about a dramatic rescue in Joshua Tree, where one of their helicopter pilots and a diver risked their lives saving a 75-year-old man whose car was stuck in a flash flood in pouring rain and 40mph winds. Soon after, the president was speaking and completely unplanned, called John up to the podium, where he had about 3 seconds to think about what to say! Sheriff McMahon chose to speak on the San Bernardino Terrorist attack and how everyone in the County came together that day.

Like the chance to speak with the President, the life of a Sheriff office is unplanned, who never know what kind of dangers, or heroics will be needed and faced at the next call. Thank you to all our officers for protecting and serving our communities.
