

This week we had our annual Patriotic program with our host **Brad Letner**. We began the program with an excerpt from President Regan's farewell address from January 1989. In his address he encouraged the Nation to keep their sense of Patriotism in the forefront of their minds and hearts. If not, it cannot be passed onto the next generation.

What is Patriotism exactly? It is devoted love, support, and defense of one's country; national loyalty and national pride. We are reminded that freedom for the USA over British Monarchs came from a small band of freedom fighters that was made up from farmers, shop owners and community leaders, like the members of the Rotary Club of Victorville.

Sadly, as the years have passed, true patriotism among Americans has waned. Of course, after the events of 9/11, there was a resurgence of Patriotism, but in 2016, it has fallen once again.

How proud are you to be an American? Gallup Pools from 2001, 2003 and 2016 show an interesting result. In 2001 55% of Americans answered as extremely proud. In 2003 after the events of 9/11the same response shot up to 70% and now in 2016, it is back down to 52%. For young people in the 18 - 29 range, the sense of proud patriotism in '01 was 51%, in '03 was 60%, and in 2016, it is an extremely low 34%. College grads as well are now under the 50% range. It seems that a breakdown shows the lowest percentage of extremely proud Americans is youth, College students and Liberals

So what can we do and what is our responsibility to honor and grow Patriotism in our community, and families. The first step is to learn about it, be knowledgeable and know what you are learning. Next is to talk about it. Ronald Regan encouraged us to talk about patriotism, and we must not be afraid to do that. Finally, we need to care and build it. The Gallup Poll looks as a report card on how we are doing as a Nation. Obviously we need to work harder.
