THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC HITS HOME

In the last 15 years, over 300,000 people have died from

of just one year. Many of the prescriptions also included


opioid overdoses, and in only the next 5 years, another 300,000 will also pass away from this epidemic. **Bill Edwards**, Club Rotarian and Director of the Victor Valley Rescue Mission spoke with some great authority on this subject, as a past addict himself, 12 years clean.

In 2017 an estimated 271 million people were recorded using drugs, and it is now 30% higher than it was 10 years ago. Places such as Africa, Asia, Europe and our own USA have seen the

increase as well as the cannabis legalization have played a big role as well. Opioids are not limited to just pain pills, Fentenol has been noted in the majority of the above mentioned deaths as well as Meth, Heroin, and cocaine have also played a part. In fact a lot of these drugs are now being combined into a kind of "super drug" which is causing faster addiction and more overdoses.

Here is how close it hits to home. Right here in Victorville the first Pharmacy in the "Operation Faux Pharmacy" Investigation by Federal Prosecutors, was Oasis Pharmacy. Owner Pauline filled at least 345 fraudulent prescriptions for oxycodone over the course

alprazolam and promathazine with codeine, also known as the "Holy Trinity" of pain pills. Using the name and DEA registration of a retired doctor, all in all they illegally gave out about 62,100 tablets of oxycodone! This was the first case to be charged under "Operation Faux Pharmacy".

With 2/3 of global deaths caused by Opioids and 35 million people suffering from addiction, it is getting out of hand. In fact, one county in

Virginia alone once sold more opioids for half the whole country could use!

It is going to take everyone working together to tackle this problem. One way is through teaching about what these drugs do and how addictive they actually are. At the Victor Valley Rescue Mission, there is a 9 month recovery program, which not only deals with helping people get off their dependency, the hows and whys, and getting into the Word of God, to steer people clear from getting re-addicted.
