George Runner on the state of Jobs and Taxes

The State of California may be unsure of the boundaries of its districts, but Senator George Runner (Retired) is totally sure of what his district (900 constituents) needs: LESS taxation and over-regulation, and MORE jobs! California has the sixth highest tax rate and the second highest unemployment rate in the nation!

As a quick overview: The tax programs administered by the State Board of Equalization (BOE) are concentrated in three general areas... sales and use taxes, property taxes, and special taxes and fees.

George wanted to discuss the ramifications of the Internet Tax, particularly the Amazon issues, whereby "associates" are unable to be based in California due to the new tax collection restriction on internet sales. California is also the loser here because no sales OR income tax is collected. It will be interesting to see how this plays out, as Amazon has filed a referendum to repeal the tax measure.

George is a member of the Lancaster West Rotary Club, and has

served in various aspects of politics for many years. We appreciate his time and the opportunity to answer our many questions.

Two New Members Inducted Into Rotary


