

The Budget, Bills and More!

Assemblyman **Jay Obernolte** was first elected to the 33rd Assembly District in December 2014. In the 2015 legislative session he had 8 bills sent to the Governor's desk and 7 were signed into law. Now in 2016, he is just as busy as ever, as he shared with a full room this week at our Club meeting.

The bill he is most proud of from 2015, AB 809, received high marks for from taxpayer protection organizations and small business advocacy groups. For any proposed local ordinance that imposes a tax or raises the rate of a tax, AB 809 would require that the ballot statement include the amount of money to be raised annually and the rate and duration of the tax to be levied. He is also very proud of AB 1034 that would amend the Surface Mining and

Reclamation Act (SMARA) of 1975 to require a lead agency to consider the construction and operation of a renewable energy generation facility on disturbed mined lands to be an interim use and would prohibit a lead agency from

In 2016 Jay Obernolte Jay Obernolte became the Vice Chair for the State Budget Committee. The road to a final approved budget begins from budgets from different offices, the Administrative Budget from the Governor's desk, the Assembly and from the Senate. From there the Chair and Vice Chair from all three offices meet and hash out the budget for the coming year and in June of this year, passed a budget.

The good news in this year's budget is that there will be an increased investment in education to our high schools and community colleges, and \$2 billion will be put into the Budget Stabilization Account; the Rainy Day Fund. On the other side of the coin, Jay could not stop the increase in State spending, which will be increasing 6% from last year. Sadly, that is 3 times the rate of inflation in California versus the Government revenue spending. If we hit another recession, the state will financially be in dire straights! Right now, by 2019 - 2020, we will have a \$4 Billion deficit at the State level, and if we hit another recession, that will increase to a whopping \$43 billion!

This year Jay Obernolte has 15 bills in the Senate. His PUC Transparency Act seeks to reform the Public Utilities Commission to show more transparency to their customers who are paying a lot for their utilities. He is also working hard to extend net metering to joint power authorities to allow small joint cities to work together to get solar, wind and wastewater treatment plants.

Jay shared one final bill that he will be working hard to pass in 2016. That bill is AB 1776 that clarifies existing law so that the removal and recycling of any spent ammunition at active outdoor shooting ranges does not change the regulatory characterization of any soil that is temporarily moved or processed onsite during recycling operations.

With that, Jay Obernolte continues to work hard for our District and fight the good fight for his constituents up in Sacramento.
