S.B. County District Attorney Mike Ramos Addresses Gang Issues

The Rotary Club of Victorville was privileged to have as guest speaker the San Bernardino County District Attorney, Mike Ramos. He is the top prosecutor in the largest county in the United States, and over the years we have seen the inroads he and his staff have made to combat crime, especially those committed by gang members. Mike currently serves as V.P. of the National District Attorney's Association and heads up the Corrections and Re-entry Committee. D.A.s from across the country look at Mike's office's expertise and protocols for fighting gangs as a national model. Since 2005, he has really beefed up the gang prosecution unit and the Sheriff's Department gang investigation unit in our county. Coupled with the "sanctions" placed on gang members, his office leads the state in the number of gang prosecutions... over 5,000 cases in nine years... prison terms totaling 36,000 years... plus 240 lifetime terms in state prison. If convicted of a crime with gang injunctions, 5 to 25 years can be added to the sentence. He emphatically states that it is his office that gets the job done, and he is very proud of his staff and lawyers, who

have prosecuted 156 cases already this year in the high desert, resulting in prison terms of a thousand years! Mike attributes this success to: Better protection of witnesses / No plea bargaining / Gang Injunctions / Prevention and Intervention (which, he feels, is key to keeping kids from joining gangs).

In addition to fighting gangs, the D.A.'s office has also set programs in place to halt and prosecute human traffickers, improve witness protection, and protect our innocent children from predators. He commended Rotary for our involvement with children in the community through our literacy and leadership programs. He also commends the Sheriff's Department, emphasizing that they all work together toward the same common goals. Two programs recently instituted are: (1) Sheriff's Inroads Program, job training for low level felons, and (2) CAPO: Crimes Against Police Officers Protection Unit. "...doing everything possible to deter, prosecute, and punish those who attack, threaten, or interfere with our law enforcement officers." We thank the D.A. for updating our Rotary Club on issues his department faces every day.


