RISE OF HYBRID

The gang situation is sadly growing in the High Desert, mainly due to the heavy amount of juveniles being arrested by officers Fernando Trujillo and Fransisco Demara.

With over 750,000 gang members in our state, 70%-80% of all crimes are committed by these individuals. A gang is considered a group of 3 or more, with a common sign or symbol whose members individually engage in criminal activity.

The crimes committed are called the "Dirty 33" and range from assault, robbery, homicide, drug smuggling, drive by shootings, arson, kidnapping, rape, intimidation, grand theft, as well as many others.

Gang members are easy for the officers to spot with noticeable tattoos, clothing, people they spend time with, tagging as well as their social media pages where they do a lot of their bragging.

Most of the current African American High Desert gangs are offshoots from the Los Angeles Area, while some of the largest Hispanic gangs up here have their origins in San Bernardino. Gangs such as West Side Verdugo, Adelanto Brown Pride and Thee Rascals are doing their share of crimes. Some of the black

gangs consist of Delman Heights Bloods, Rollin 60's and Grape Street Watts Crips.

The two largest factions of gangs are of course the Bloods and Crips. In Los Angles, one member is forbidden, by way of death, from consorting with another rival gang, but for some reason in the High Desert, this is not an issue, so the officers are seeing a rise in Hybrid Gangs. Hybrid Gangs consist of

both of these factions, such as the Below Underground Gang (BUG), which began as a multi-racial rap group at Silverado High School in the early 90's, and now has grown into a criminal gang element, committing crimes such as assault, robberies, terrorists threats and more. Sadly, it doesn't end there.

Another gang formed out of Silverado is Mostwanted, and over in Adelanto High School is My Only Brothers (MOB), while Victor Valley High School carries the Pimpboys (PBS).

Younger gang members are trying to make a name for themselves by tagging throughout the High Desert. Because they are working hard to impress the O.G.'s, they can be very dangerous, so the officers requests that if you see tagging being done, don't approach them, but be a good witness and report the incident. The officers are seeing a rise in anti police tagging, so please keep them in your thoughts and prayers


Raffle
