BUSINESS IDENTITY THEFT PROTECTION... BE PREPARED

David North of DCB and Teressa DeAtley of Citizen's Business Bank presented information this week about security in banking, with David stating that "I.D. Theft is the fastest growing crime in America. Anywhere from nine to eleven million people are victimized each year, costing consumers about \$5 billion dollars, and costing banks and corporations about \$56 billion dollars!" It can cost an average of \$1,173 to clean up an identity breach, taking up to 175 hours!

These two banking professionals demonstrated the obligations we have as business owners or managers to protect our customers. A video from Citizen's Business Bank web site showed the various ways a business owner can protect themselves, their employees, and their business. The content of the video was provided by the U.S. Federal Trade Commission, and showed what information thieves are looking for, and how they gain access to it. Social Security numbers, credit card numbers, and other sensitive data should be kept protected as much as possible, and a plan should be in place to prevent a security breach.

David and Teressa handed out two great handouts. A brochure from EastWest Bank details how to "Protect Yourself From



Fraud", and another entitled, "Five Key Points to a Sound Data Security Plan": (1) Take Stock: Know what personal information you have in your files and on your computers. (2) Scale Down: Keep only what you need for business purposes. (3) Lock It: Protect the information that you keep. (4) Pitch It: Properly dispose of what you no longer need. (5) Plan Ahead: Create a plan for responding to security incidents.
