

A BLIND MAN, A GUIDE DOG AND 1,463 STEPS

Inspiration comes in many form and this week, as we heard from acclaimed author and public speaker **Michael Hingson**, his came in the form of his Guide Dog Roselle. Roselle was with him

on the fateful day of 9-11 as they were on the 78th floor of the World Trade Center Tower I.

Michael has been blind since birth but that has not stopped him. Where he lacks in sight, he flourishes in many other areas of his life. He graduated High School with a 3.54 grade average, he attained the rank of Eagle Scout and was inducted into the Order of the Arrow, where he rose to the highest honor a Boy Scout can receive, known as Vigil. He was determined not to be viewed as a burden on anyone or anything, and that helped him rise to a great level of success in the business world.

In 1999, he worked for Quantum Corp. on the 23rd floor of the World Trade Center, and while the company was expanding, they needed more space, so after a long search he found what he was looking for, on the 78th floor. In August 2001, he was asked to do a sales seminar to nationwide salespeople on

how to market and sell their product. The date chosen for the seminar; September 11.

Joining him everywhere he goes at that time was Roselle, a yellow Lab. A Guide Dog's job is not to tell his person where

to go or how to get there, that is Michael's duty; it's their job to get them there safely, and that is exactly what Roselle did, day after day. They were very close and had a great

bond between them, where they trusted each other explicitly. One thing scared Roselle, and that was thunderstorms, so Michael was keenly aware of when the dog was experiencing fear. In fact around 2am on the morning of 9-11 there was a thunderstorm right above their home, and Michael had to take her downstairs to his office until it passed, due to her shaking and nervousness. Was that a warning of what was to come...Decide for yourself.

That morning Michael and his business partner David were welcoming people into their office to begin the seminar and at 8:45, as he was reaching for a stack of papers, it happened. 18 floors above him and on the other side of the building they heard a loud explosion and they were

thrown about 20 feet as the Tower began tipping. What made it so bad, was that it kept on tipping, so much in fact that Michael began saying goodbye to everyone, believing that this was the end of his life. Then suddenly, the tipping stopped and they became upright again.

Not knowing what was going on, except that it was something very bad, his partner David was panicking, as most of us would, but it was soon to become worse. Without warning the building dropped about 6 feet as the infrastructure was showing signs of weakness, which now caused David to go from panic to outright freaking out, which affected everyone in the room.

Michael reached down to Roselle, who was sleeping under his desk. Roselle awoke, gave a yawn and was completely bored at the situation. Knowing his companion was not panicked, Michael knew he should not panic, and told his partner to get a grip, focus and get the people to calmly head to the staircase and go down. There began Michael's journey, with Roselle leading the way, down 1,463 steps and to safety. During the decent they passed fighter fighters, smelled the burning jet fuel, which is where he finally realized a plane had struck the Tower.

Once in the lobby they were ushered out a back way, because of the airplane parts and bodies from jumpers that were falling from the sky at the font of tower. Once outside they escaped both towers falling, with Michael, feeling the dirt and ash settling in his lungs due to the collapsing Twin Towers. What began his day as a thunderstorm at 2am, ended with him seeing his wife, at 7pm that night.
