

July 26, 2022 THE FUTURE OF PUBLIC TRANSIT

As the Marketing Manager and Public Information Officer for Victor Valley Transit, **Chris Ackerman** recently surveyed VVTA passengers and what was important to them. This week, Chris shared some exciting new services and announcements to address the needs of their riding passengers.

For passengers who expressed that convenience was a priority Victor Valley Transit is ecstatic

that beginning Fall of 2022, a new micro transit pilot program called Micro-Link will commence adding to its existing fixed routes and ADA Paratransit services.

Micro-Link is a service that gives passengers the freedom to book a ride through an app utilizing their smartphone, similar to Uber and Lyft, within the three designated zones, and those without a smartphone will be able to dial in a reservation. A fourth zone is on the horizon if the program proves successful.

Micro-Link Zone 1 will service South Victorville from Palmdale Road, South to Bear Valley Road, between Amargosa Road and Hwy 395. Micro-Link Zone 2 will cover North Victorville from Palmdale Road, North to Hopland St, between the 15 Fwy/Village Drive and Hwy 395. Micro-Link Zone 3 service area will cover Hesperia from Main St, south to Ranchero Road, between 3rd Ave and Mariposa and the 15 Freeway, and the possible fourth zone will service Apple Valley.

Residents who do not reside near a VVTA bus stop, parents with children in schools located within the zones, and those wishing to get to local appointments without the worry or concern of being late or missing their bus home, will find Micro-Link extremely beneficial.

For passengers who voiced that reducing the carbon footprint was essential, VVTA is moving forward in its continued commitment to becoming a

Zero Emission fleet with the introduction of Hydrogen Fuel Cell Buses.

Since December 2018, after CARB announced that California Public Transit Agencies were required to transition its bus fleets to zero-emission buses (ZEBs) by 2040, VVTA has remained aggressive in getting an early start on this transition.

Reducing its carbon footprint and greenhouse emissions has always been a priority by running a CNG fleet with renewable natural gas and becoming the first agency in San Bernardino County to place Battery Electric Buses into service.

After purchasing Battery Electric Buses, the agency is now moving into Hydrogen Fuel Cell Buses, as they will increase their efficiency in serving the community, such as the length of their course, charging times, miles per charge, and more. The agency plans on building infrastructure and placing orders now while funding is available.

The Hesperia station and eight buses are planned to be in service by 2024, followed by a Barstow station. The hydrogen fueling station planned for Hesperia will meet the needs of a full Hesperia Hydrogen fleet. To expand the Battery Electric Bus fleet, constant infrastructure improvements and construction would be required. With Hydrogen Fuel Cell, they don't have to constantly build to keep up, and VVTA can build infrastructure without having to add more stations and include additional buses as needed. A BEB station has a life of 6-12 years and in most cases, this means a station will be replaced every time a BEB is retired.

Thanks in part to a successful "Transit Recruitment Event" they hold every Tuesday from 9 am – 1 pm in Hesperia, there are enough operators in training right now that they should be ready to return to pre-covid service, later this year.
