## DISTRICT GOVERNOR SYLVIA WHITLOCK VISITS ROTARY CLUB OF VICTORVILLE



D.G. Whitlock's message to the Rotary Club of Victorville was loud and clear... "When you give of yourself, you truly give".

In 1982, while an Elementary School Principal in Duarte, CA., she was invited to join the history-making Ex-Rotary Club of Duarte. Sylvia became President of that club in 1987, the year the United States Supreme Court ruled that the club be reinstated, thus making her the first woman in the Rotary World to head a club as President!

Having been a Rotarian for 25 years, "De Gov", as she is affectionately referred to, Sylvia shared how her youthful beginnings shaped her passion for Rotary. She grew up in Kingston, Jamaica with her grandparents, who illustrated "Service Above Self" every day. Sylvia remembers vividly an occasion of her grandmother's generosity to a stranger, and when questioned, made the statement to Sylvia: "People would do the same thing for you and your children"; a very early example of paying it forward. Sylvia told us, "We were not rich or privileged, but we had enough to share, and that's what it's all about."

Sylvia considers Rotary to be the best vehicle she knows for humanitarian ventures in service to mankind. She reminds us that we are citizens of the world, and all that transpires throughout the world has a ripple effect on us, to the extent that all the world will be our world.

Sylvia encourages Rotarians to find a painless way to put money aside for good causes, and choose one of the many projects Rotary endorses. We appreciate a visit from the District Governor, and will continue to support her causes.


