Mattie Brown has had a long history in the High Desert and the Rotary Club of Victorville. Along with her husband, the late Dr. Jerry Brown they made the Victor Valley their home, as she shared with the Club this week.

They moved to the High Desert in 1957, when there were no stop lights on Bear Valley Road and the city literally was closed by 8:30pm every night. The High Desert needed an oral surgeon, so they made their lives here,

to service patients in need. Jerry was both President of the Club and



President of the Victorville Chamber of Commerce from 1985-1986.

When it came to Rotary, Jerry and Mattie were all in and during his

tenure he began the first New Year's Party, which was later combined into the Demotion Party. They also held the first Super Bowl party, before it became a Russ and Gaylynn Stringham event. Another first



Mattie was a Rotary-Ann. A Rotary-Ann was the female spouse to a Rotary member, when women were not allowed to be Rotarians. The terms began in 1914 when San Francisco Rotarians boarded a special train to attend the Rotary Convention being held in Houston. In those days few wives attended Rotary events, and until the train stopped in Los Angeles, the only woman aboard was the wife of

Rotarian Brunnier. As the train picked up additional convention-bound delegates, Mrs. **Ann Brunnier** was introduced as the Rotarian's Ann. This title soon became "Rotary Ann". It was always "Rotary-Ann + first name", so she became known as Rotary-Ann Mattie. Mattie became an Honorary Rotarian, after the passing of her husband.

When asked what her greatest accomplishment was in the Club, her answer was simply, "Going to parties"! In all seriousness, she shared it was the "Read to Me" program her husband started. Every Thursday, he would read to kindergarten students and the program grew from there. After he passed away, it was named after him, the "Jerry Brown Read to Me" Program.

Margaret Cooker shared that Jerry served as a mentor to her and Steve Murray added that Jerry could come up to a podium, not saying a

word and with just his stare, could quiet the room! Their son **Dexter Brown** thanked the Club for treating his parents so well and has fond memories as serving as the bartender for all

Volunteers such as friends and neighbors transport transit-dependent elderly, people with disabilities, and others to access medical and other services where no transit service exists. The TRIP Program provides an incentive for volunteer drivers to assist eligible individuals who are unable to drive or access public transportation by providing necessary, escorted transportation. Participants receive funds to reimburse the volunteer driver and to offset the cost associated with providing transportation.
