Walking around, Jeff and Christy noticed a fountain that had a familiar symbol, the Rotary Logo. As they explored further they found more. One thing they did notice is that this park was set back over 700ft. from the Red River with elevation separations, and

soon they found the reason why.

In 1997 there was a record Flood there. In fact there had been horrible floods also in 1950, 1850 and even



as far back as 1797! Every time the community came together to rebuild, but in 1997, Rotarians did something different, they

fixed it.



Following the devastating flood of 1997, Grand Forks Rotarians spearheaded the fundraising events necessary to create and maintain the Rotary Park located on the Greenway near the Sorlie Bridge in downtown Grand Forks. Contacting Rotary Clubs. checks were written and funds were raised to fix the problem once and for

all. With the help of Rotarians around the Globe, \$409 million was raised for a re-enforced levee system, and since the flood an additional \$1 Billion dollars has been spent along the Red River to protect it.

While not all the money was raised strictly from Rotary, the organization played a big part in getting the work done and funded. So much so, this park is in dedication to the great work done by many Rotarians.
