THE SLOW AND STEADY GROWTH

The San Bernardino County Fair is the largest, longest running event of its type in the County, with 2022 being the 75th year running. The first fair was held in Victorville in 1929, then revived in 1947 after a 17-year hiatus. The main focus of the fair is to serve our communities as well as offer opportunities to local business and organizations for 30+ food booths and 160+ Marketplace exhibitors. Geoff states that local businesses and vendors are the first to get an opportunity to participate in vending (food /product sales). Multiple local community groups raise funds during Fair, including SBCSD Search & Rescue, Apple Valley

COP's, American Legion, Victory Outreach, and many more. There are agreements in place with Victor Valley Rescue Mission and Victorville Homeless Shelter for shelter and other needs.

More than 300 local youth raise and exhibit their livestock, and the market quality animals go to the Junior Livestock Auction, which generates over \$250,000 in local livestock education funding each year. There are 350 categories in the Arts and Crafts exhibitions, with more than \$25,000 in prize money awarded to local exhibitors. The Fair layout and product mix are constantly being evaluated so that it evolves and improves each Fair cycle.

There is virtually no California General Fund support (less than \$40,000 annually). The annual budget is approximately 2.5 million dollars, and the economic impact to our communities exceed \$20 million and create 159 jobs! To generate additional funding, the Fairgrounds are used for Satellite Wagering and private events.
