## August 10, 2021 HOLDING ON UNTIL SEPTEMBER 4TH

Where did all the employees go? There is a hiring shortage all around the United States, and **Robert Lovingood**, President of ICR Staffing, former 1st District Supervisor and Rotarian shed some light on this and helped the Club understand that the problem lies with Stimulus Checks and Cares Act unemployment benefits.

The IRS issued three Economic Impact Payments during the coronavirus

pandemic for people who were eligible: \$1,200 in April 2020, \$600 in December 2020/January 2021 and \$1,400 in March 2021. On top of that, the Cares Act for individuals who qualify, receive an extra \$600 on top of their bi-weekly \$225 checks. Due to all of this, it truly is financially beneficial for many Americans to stay home, then go to work. For those who used to make \$22,000 a year, now are able to make \$40,000 by not finding a job!

The outcome of this is a major hiring shortage going on in our country, but it is about to all end. September 4th to be exact. Robert based this off the end of the first round of benefits of \$600. Once the benefits expired people started to be back out looking for work, until another round of unemployment benefits began. The

second round was even more money, so it became even more enticing not to look for a job.

The result is a huge impact on business owners. Companies have had to adjust, with increased labor costs, without the ability to raise their fees to customers. Currently, lack of experience can command \$17 per hour with full benefits. Drivers with a Class C License can get \$25 per hour with benefits. In the

Inland Empire, there are 2,000 forklift jobs that cannot be filled which is driving up costs for these companies.

It has gotten so bad that some companies are now offering bonuses and incentives for employees to show up for their whole work-shift week, as many are taking 3-5 day weekends at times. Say an employee just doesn't show up for work on a Tuesday. The call they receive is not, "You're Fired!", but "Will you be able to come in tomorrow?". Hiring incentives aren't working either. Robert shared an example of someone who was offered a \$10,000 sign on bonus and was turned down! But an end looks to be in sight.

Unless President Biden extends these unemployment benefits, it will all come to an end on September 4th. Robert predicts, as before that once the money isn't being given to them, people will be back out looking for work and soon positions will be filled quickly. Of course, if the benefits are once again extended, it will continue to be challenging for understaffed businesses to run.

Which leaves us with one final question. Once this happens and positions are filled, will HR Departments remember those employees who came to work whenever they felt like it? I think so...
