The Future of (Virtual) Learning

Dr. Ron Williams and the staff at the Victor Valley Union High School District have had a very busy week. School started by all the campus' served by the District, but right up to the first day of school, things were changing and formatting moment by moment. In fact, things have been quite busy for them for the last few months, since COVID-19 has put in-class learning in jeopardy for our local students.

Since May, the District has looked at guidances from 8 different groups,

including monthly surveys, stakeholder meetings and State & County collaborations with parents, employees, students, and other Superintendent's organizations.

As predicted, in all surveys and discussions, the number one goal is to have all students back inside classrooms, but unfortunately that is not able to be a reality at this moment. The District has identified a five phase plan for reopening and at this point, The WUHSD is only at Phase One.

Phase One is 100% distance learning, with at home virtual classes. All classes start at 8am in the morning for every school and each period lasts 31 minutes (+ 5 minute breaks) with school concluding each day at 12:07pm. After a lunch break for

the teachers and staff, tutoring for students begin at 2:50pm for any students needing help. Distance learning consists of using Acellus & Canvas softwares plus enhanced Google Classrooms.

As of this writing, the school year is entering its second week and have held check-in events for students to receive or turn in textbooks, Chromebooks, WiFi Hot Spots and everything else they need for a successful school year. Students and staff are adapting to the changes, and reports

are that instruction is proceeding smoothly.

Although Ron doesn't know when Phase Two will begin, they are hoping for sooner than later. In the next phase, teachers and staff will be back at their schools (currently most teach from home) and students in groups of 25% will attend class 1 day a week and the other days online. During Phase Three students in groups of 50% will attend 2 days and week and so on until the final phase when schools go back 100% with no restrictions.

Another important component to our students' success is the food service program. As studies have shown, it is very hard to focus on learning on an empty stomach and many families struggle to eat everyday. No matter how long this lasts, all qualifying students will be provided lunch. Students on distance learning receive "Grab & Go" meals 5 days a week.

Although changes are happening in a moments' notice, communicating with parents, students and staff members is of the utmost importance to the District. Platforms such as ZOOM, Facebook, Twitter, parent phone messages, emails and virtual community forums are used to accomplish this. Times are challenging, but the District is adapting to these changes.

Bill Edwards shared with the Club the Rotary auction is now completed! We have raised just




(about 1/3 of what we would normally make at our annual fundraiser). We still need to raise more. so there will


