High Desert Commercial Real Estate 2013 Mid Year Review



Speaker Jason Lamoreaux and Ben Tafoya

Jason Lamoreaux of Caldwell Banker Commercial, and an Apple Valley Rotarian, made an insightful and optimistic presentation to the Rotary Club of Victorville this week. His topic was High Desert commercial real estate, and we were offered a glimmer of hope for the residential market as well, according to several statistics cited by Jason. He and his family have been involved in high desert real estate since 1979, so he has seen a few cycles of the economy and how these cycles affect our housing and commercial markets.

Currently, median house prices are now over \$150,000, and there is new interest in commercial real estate. Jason explained how home sales drive commercial sales by the increase in jobs, consumer spending and the added tax base. He also drew parallels between consumer confidence, the stock market and Treasury bonds, supported

by slides showing these statistics and how they compare over the last ten years or so. The information below shows highlights in the recent commercial real estate market which supports Jason's optimistic outlook for the High Desert. As there is increased demand for land, builders will increase production. This was an interesting program, thank you, Jason, and we can see the numbers speak for themselves:

- 64% Increase in sales volume
- 23% Increase in transactions over 2012
- Commercial vacancy rates among the lowest in the Inland Empire
- Lease rates across all sectors have stabilized
- New housing starts Increased demand in land
- 7% 9% Increase in taxable retail sales
- 2.2% Increase in population 442,000 Total
