

Although he may be a Freshman in D.C., Congressman Jay Obernolte is a veteran when it comes to politics, especially in the area of budgeting. He occasionally loves it, other times it can be quote challenging. When he spoke to the Club this week, Jay focused on our currently inflation crisis.

The reason for it quite simply all of the Stimulus checks that have gone out. Over the past year the Government has spent 4 trillion solely on Coronavirus relief, but the challenge is that what the Government usually spends normally for everything else! That means last year, it has doubled its spending. In the past sixteen months over 6 billion has been spent. When this amount of spending is going on, the rise of inflation is the next step. Prices for goods and services has to go up. This year has seen a rise of over 5%, the most rapid rise in the last 30 years.

This includes the recent rise in food costs, lumber and even gasoline.

When inflation is caused by Government, it increases the problem for the homeless and poor to climb out of their current situations. As Jay mentioned, he can afford a rise in the price of milk, but many other Americans cannot.

And it doesn't end there. Two Bills up for vote will increase the spending to heights not seen since the Eisenhower days. One of the bills is good in individual parts, such as free kindergarten, paid family leave and free Community College for two years, but put all together at once, our inflation will go through the roof!

The result will be 10% of everything the country makes to pay pack the National Debit, will not lower it, just pay the interest! Federal Law has a debit limit of 28 trillion... and we hit that last July.

There could be a government shut down

this Fall, unless Congress votes to raise the National Debit. But that is only a band-aid, not a solution. The solution is to build prosperity in our county to grow the economy, and double the size over the next decade. On top of that they need to have a commitment to their fiscal responsibility and pay the debt down. The Government can't ask families to be smart with their spending, when their leaders cannot.

Thank you Congressmen Jay Obernolte for fighting the good fight in Washington for the people you represent.
