# Mixing it up in Adelanto with Bill Scott, Owner of Scott Turbon Mixer

Rotary's off-site visit to member Bill Scott's manufacturing facility was nothing less than amazing. Bill refers to his business as one of the "little guys", but there's nothing little about the magnitude of the mixers he designs and builds in his Adelanto location. The first thing Bill stressed is how difficult it is to get good blue collar employees (welders and machinists). He implored the business people of the Rotary community to be aware of this, and to encourage our youth to think of the trades as a career, and show them the many opportunities available through some type of formal program. Prior to getting out into the plant and seeing these mixers "on steroids", Bill gave some history on his business, which started in 1980. His specialty is high speed mixers, concentrated in the food, pharmaceutical, cosmetic, and dairy industries. He works with many of the smaller companies; however, his focus on emulsions (salad dressings) has brought many clients with huge market shares, such as Ken's Salad Dressings. The mixers at Scott Turbon Mixer can mix at an astounding speed, and Bill says they do more



things better and faster than the standard mixer in the industry. It was a fun and fascinating off-site for our Rotary Club, and we thank Bill for the education on mixer technology!

# FINE & RAFFLE SESSION:






