## REAL ESTATE STUFF



Is another real estate crash coming? Many think so, but according to **Jason Lamoreaux**, President of Coldwell Banker Commercial Real Estate and Home Source Residential, this is different than 2016.

The year 2020 was a complete recycle of the real estate industry. In just 10 months, residential transactions slowed, commercial brokerage sales stalled with the exception of seasoned investors, commercial leasing stalled and property management saw changes rapidly.

In the residential real estate market, the industry came to a complete halt in March and April of 2020, as many homes were in

the pipeline, and agents had to figure out to how to show homes safely. In May, the lull lifted and in 2020 so far Coldwell Banker Home Source are looking at their largest year ever with upwards of 1400 homes to be sold. This is not surprising though to Jason as the Inland Empire is No. 5 area of where people want to move to in California and the High Desert still has the lowest home prices.

While it may seem so, we did not go back to the levels of 2010 when you could buy a home for a dime. The residential industry has low inventory, but steady sales. This has resulted in homes selling quicker, with buyers paying sometimes over \$50,000 the listing price of a home. When things are normal there is a 6 month inventory of homes. Currently, there is only an inventory of 1.5 of homes available. While it may seem like a supply issue, it's just not true, homes are just selling faster.

As of July 2021, sellers are finally coming back into line, and the days of selling homes more than their worth is over. This is because of buyers fatigue. They are tired of writing so many offers and going through escrow over and over again. The good news is that the residential market is still on a steady climb, already higher than it was in 2016.

In the area of commercial real estate, surprisingly many businesses did better during the pandemic. In actuality, vacancy rates declined, rental rates increased, while delinquencies were less than 3% and the vacancy rate was below 4%. For many parts of the country, Zoom hurt the office market, but not in rural areas, like the High Desert.


The industrial market was quite the same with delinquencies less than 1% and vacancy rates below 4%. Retail has grown as well, and the same can be said for the healthy land real estate market, as we still have a lot of room to grow.
