

# **Jay Johnstone Pitches to the Rotary Club of Victorville**

Baseball great Jay Johnstone, former Angel and Dodger outfielder, delivered hilarious stories and pranks he was involved in over his 20-year span playing in the major leagues. Jay has four World Series rings, a lifetime batting average in the World Series of 435, and holds the highest batting average in National championship play of 778! He also has a total of 102 career home runs. Jay is a 32-year Rotarian and Paul Harris Fellow, and has authored three books, two of which are best sellers!

In his career playing on eight baseball teams, Jay built a reputation of not only a dependable pinch hitter, but was known as the "Prince of Pranks", "Moonman" and "Major League Prankster". He shared many great stories of his involvement in pranks (quite often paired up with jokester and roommate Jerry Reuss) played on other baseball greats. Tommy Lasorda, Jerry Reuss, Billy Martin, and George Steinbrenner were just a few of the victims of the mostly harmless pranks.

He is the national spokesperson for "Hope4Heroes", a program to assist our nation's wounded in action. Hope4Heroes is a 501(c) 3 organization and is dedicated to giving back 90 percent of all donations to veterans and families in need. The organization has a number of programs dedicated to supporting wounded veterans including career counselors, PTSD counseling, and emergency funds for families. For more information and /or


