Rotary Club welcomes John McMahon, S.B. County Sheriff

The Rotary Club of Victorville was fortunate this week to have San Bernardino County Sheriff John McMahon as speaker. He was introduced by Victorville Station Captain Sam Lucia, who stated the Sheriff brings transparency and organizational vision to his position.

Sheriff McMahon grew up in Apple Valley, has been with the Department for 28 years in 17 different assignments with the County, and held about every rank within the organization (except Under Sheriff). He was appointed to his position as Sheriff following Sheriff Hoops' retirement late in 2012, and has spent most of his career in the H.D. Sheriff McMahon talked about the many challenges faced by law enforcement today in light of prison realignment, crime, and a difficult budget process. Prison realignment has resulted in overcrowding, early release of dangerous inmates, and shorter sentences. Since Oct., 2011 under realignment, criminals who are non-violent, non-sexual, or non-habitual stay in the County jail, which is becoming over crowded, and are being released 270 days earlier

than their sentence. Sheriff McMahon feels that in addition to some comprehensive rehabilitation programs being put into place, the Adelanto Detention Center will help immeasurably. Staffing will be phased in beginning in 2014. Less than two months after being sworn in, McMahon's leadership abilities were put to the test when the statewide manhunt for rogue ex-Los Angeles police Officer Christopher Dorner made its way to the San Bernardino Mountains. Dorner engaged a sheriff's SWAT team in a gun battle in which sheriff's Detective Jeremiah MacKay was killed and Deputy Alex Collins was seriously wounded. At the end of the ordeal, Dorner took his
