Family Law was the toughest assignment for Kirt. The reason for that is you are dealing with children and lives. Most Judges do not want that assignment, but Kirt did.

decisions one has had to make, then Kirt felt he wasn't doing his job right. In the area of children in divorce, Kirt would actually meet with the children, not to ask whom they want to live with, but to put a real person behind who was making these important decisions in their lives.

Being in the courts for 20 years, Kirt has been at the forefront of change of the judicial landscape. For example, when he was in College, the question was brought up if he would allow a same sex couple to adopt, whereas in 2018 it's not even a question anymore, as it is an accepted and normal practice.

Kirt shared some funny stories during his time in Traffic Court, but the best story he told, was the most heartwarming.

During a Christmas season a woman was caught speeding excessively in Barstow. During this time the Police had their "Cops & Kids" program where they would buy presents for underprivileged kids. As his practice Kirt would offer people found guilty in Traffic Court to take 10% off their fine to buy a present and give it to the Program. The woman agreed and returned with twice the amount she would have owed in presents. Later on, he found out why.

The day the woman was pulled over, her husband earlier that day called her ugly, useless and had no purpose in this world. She was out speeding as a way to take her own life in a suicide attempt. When she was given the option to go buy presents for these children, she told Kirt that it made her somebody and that she did have a purpose in the world, His actions, saved her life.
