Rotary Club Members Speak on a Moment's Notice



Rick Hampton spoke today about how his company steps in and helps in a disaster. In Rick's words:

"Our company is part of a national storm team within Servpro. This year we have travelled to Albuquerque, NM; El Paso, TX; Minot, ND; and we are now in New Haven, CT. Not all Servpro's respond to disasters. We have been a part of the team for 4 years. The hurricane caused a lot more damage than is shown on television. There are many homes with basements and many have flooded out due to the heavy rains associated with the hurricane. Many of these claims are covered because the electricity went out and the sump pumps in the basements could not remove the water. This is very fortunate for those affected, but the damage is overwhelming and their lives disrupted. It is our goal to get the customers back in their homes as quickly as possible and minimize the traumatic experience of such a devastating disaster.

We have two crews currently in New Haven. They work seven days a week and 12 to 14 hours a day. It is very arduous work but very rewarding for them as they feel like they are part of something much bigger. A part of history. Hundreds of thousands of people are still without power and it is making it difficult for cleanup operations. Our crews bring in generators, drying, and cleaning equipment to be completely self contained and able to do the work without the assistance of local utilities.

This cleanup operation is expected to last 30 to 45 days with thousands of Servpro teams up and down the eastern seaboard." Thank you very much for the info, Rick! Al Castellucci sits on several hospital Boards of Direc-

tors. This week he offered some interesting facts about the use of a relatively new technology for the treatment of cancer and other diseases. It is a Proton Accelerators.

The characteristics of proton beam therapy enable the physician to deliver full or higher doses


while sparing surrounding healthy tissues and organs. At Loma Linda, the first patient was successfully treated with Proton Accelerators in 1990 for an optic nerve melanoma. Very interesting; thank you, Al!
